

Update on COVID-19 Test Availability and Ordering

MDH: The MDH Critical Supplies Warehouse has distributed all COVID-19 OTC tests that were being held for free distribution to our partners. Requests can no longer be filled through this local distribution channel.


Health Partner Order Portal (HPoP): Free COVID-19 testing supplies are available for bulk ordering through the federal test distribution program. These tests are available until HPoP distributes their remaining inventory. At that time, it appears free test distribution will end, and new plans should be made by your organization to acquire tests. This may include purchasing tests through third party vendors.

- You will need to order through Health Partner Order Portal (HPoP). Most sites have utilized this program in the past to order COVID-19 therapeutics and/or MPOX vaccines and therapeutics.
- The tests that are currently being distributed are the CorDx tests and will be received in 1-2 weeks after your order.
- Tests need to be ordered in multiples of 600 (one case). This is the minimum order quantity. It is suggested that you work with your partners to share these tests if you feel 600 is too many.
- To place an order in HPoP, each site will require the ability to order COVID-19 diagnostics in HPoP. That ability must be enabled by MDH and can be completed by following the instructions below.

Access to HPop:

- If your site already has HPoP access, the following steps should be taken
 - Send an email to <u>MDH.Warehouse@state.mn.us</u> expressing your interest in ordering tests.
 - Once the warehouse receives this request, access to order tests will be enabled and instructions will be sent for the ordering process.
 - Place order for tests in HPoP.
- If your site does not have HPoP access, please send an email to MDH.Warehouse@state.mn.us expressing your interest in creating an HPoP account to order tests. Once the warehouse receives the email, you will be contacted to set up an account.

Overdose Response Training

Naloxone Training at Sherburne County

The first Overdose Response Training supported by the Central Region's MRC-STRONG grant has been scheduled!

We have partnered with the Steve Rummler HOPE Network to provide a training on the administration of naloxone, the medication that can reverse an opioid overdose. During this free one-hour training a number of topics will be covered, including:

- Key info on opioids and current data on the opioid crisis
 How to recognize signs of an opioid overdose
 What naloxone is, and how it works to reverse an opioid overdose
 The action steps when responding to an overdose
 How to administer intramuscular and nasal naloxone

- Protections provided, such as MN's Good Samaritan Law/Naloxone Law, also known as "Steve's Law"
- Where and how to get low or no cost naloxone



Physical & Cybersecurity Infrastructure Protection Training

For West Central Coalition Partners Only

The 18-county West Central Region for emergency managed will be hosting two physical and cybersecurity infrastructure protection training courses in early October. Participants can attend one or both, and there are no prerequisites for either. Both will be offered at the **Douglas County Public Works Facility** in Alexandria (location details in the flyers linked below.). Plan for each course to go from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The two courses that will be offered are:

October 8: MGT-414 Critical Infrastructure Resilience and Community Lifelines

In this course participants will enhance their skills to formulate considerations for the resiliency of jurisdictional assets leveraging cross-sector partnerships. These considerations will enhance the whole community's ability to manage the risk associated with critical infrastructure protection efforts. The course will implement the National Preparedness Goal and formulate considerations for improving community resilience and develop an understanding of Community Lifelines. October 9: MGT 452 Physical and Cybersecurity for Critical Infrastructure

The purpose of the course is to increase collaborative efforts among and between individuals and organizations responsible for both physical and cybersecurity. This collaboration will lead toward the development of integrated risk management strategies that lead to the enhanced capabilities necessary for the protection of our nation's critical infrastructure. The course identifies physical and cybersecurity concerns impacting overall infrastructure security posture, examines integrated physical and cybersecurity incidents as well as the evolving risks and impacts they pose to critical infrastructure. It also introduces key concepts and resources that can be applied to improve security within an organization, business, or government entity. Click here to view the flyer for more information.
