Microsoft Warns of Ransomware Threat to US **Healthcare by Vanilla Tempest**


Microsoft has issued a warning about a cybercrime group known as Vanilla Tempest, which is using the INC ransomware to target US healthcare organizations. This group primarily exploits systems already infected with Gootloader malware, using it to gain access and deploy ransomware. Vanilla Tempest utilizes tools like the Supper backdoor and remote management software such as AnyDesk to infiltrate networks and move laterally via Remote Desktop Protocol (RDP).

Active for at least two years, Vanilla Tempest has also targeted education, IT, and manufacturing sectors. Their activities show overlap with another group, Vice Society, which has been active since mid-2021 and is linked to multiple ransomware families, including BlackCat and Rhysida. The INC ransomware, part of a ransomware-as-a-service (RaaS) model, has been deployed by Vanilla Tempest for about a year, indicating they may operate as affiliates within a larger network of cybercriminals. 

Physical & Cybersecurity Infrastructure Protection Training

For West Central Coalition Partners Only

The 18-county West Central Region for emergency managed will be hosting two physical and cybersecurity infrastructure protection training courses in early October. Participants can attend one or both, and there are no prerequisites for either. Both will be offered at the **Douglas County Public Works Facility** in Alexandria (location details in the flyers linked below.). Plan for each course to go from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The two courses that will be offered are:

October 8: MGT-414 Critical Infrastructure Resilience and Community Lifelines

In this course participants will enhance their skills to formulate considerations for the resiliency of jurisdictional assets leveraging cross-sector partnerships. These considerations will enhance the whole community's ability to manage the risk associated with critical infrastructure protection efforts. The course will implement the National Preparedness Goal and formulate considerations for improving community resilience and develop an understanding of Community Lifelines.

October 9: MGT 452 Physical and Cybersecurity for Critical Infrastructure

The purpose of the course is to increase collaborative efforts among and between individuals and organizations responsible for both physical and cybersecurity. This collaboration will lead toward the development of integrated risk management strategies that lead to the enhanced capabilities necessary for the protection of our nation's critical infrastructure. The course identifies physical and cybersecurity concerns impacting overall infrastructure security posture, examines integrated physical and cybersecurity incidents as well as the evolving risks and impacts they pose to critical infrastructure. It also introduces key concepts and resources that can be applied to improve security within an organization, business, or government entity.

Naloxone Training at Sherburne County

The first Overdose Response Training supported by the Central Region's MRC-STRONG grant has been scheduled!

We have partnered with the Steve Rummler HOPE Network to provide a training on the administration of naloxone, the medication that can reverse an opioid overdose. During this free one-hour training a number of topics will be covered, including:

Key info on opioids and current data on the opioid crisis

How to recognize signs of an opioid overdose

What naloxone is, and how it works to reverse an opioid overdose

The action steps when responding to an overdose

How to administer intramuscular and nasal naloxone

Protections provided, such as MN's Good Samaritan Law/Naloxone Law, also known as "Steve's Law"

- Where and how to get low or no cost naloxone
