COVID-19 Testing

Order Your 4 Free At-home COVID-19 Tests

Every U.S. household is eligible to order 4 free at-home tests.

ASPR COVID-19 Testing

Every U.S. household is eligible to order **4 free at-home tests**. An order of COVID tests is completely free.

COVID-19 testing helps people know if they have COVID-19 so they can decide what to do next, like getting treatment to reduce their risk of severe illness and taking steps to lower their chances of spreading the virus to others.

The tests available for order:

- Are rapid antigen at-home tests, not PCR
- Can be taken at home or other locations. Give results within 30 minutes (no lab drop-off required)
- Can be used for testing even if the person does not have COVID-19 symptoms
- Can be used for testing whether the person is up to date on their COVID-19 vaccines or not
- Are also referred to as self-tests or over the counter (OTC) tests

FREE Rural Continuity Of Operations Plan (COOP) Workshops for LTC

Continuity Of Operations Planning is used for mitigation and planning strategies that create resilience and allow services to continue to be provided in the face of a range of challenges.

The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) contracted with All Clear Emergency Management Group to conduct two inperson workshops to help long-term care facilities, skilled nursing facilities, and assisted living facilities develop their COOP.

This 8-hour awareness-level, instructor-led course is designed to prepare rural first responders and officials with the basic knowledge, skills and abilities to manage a mass fatality incident impacting their jurisdiction. Target audience includes first responders, coroners/medical examiners, public health officials, and others with responsibilities during a mass fatality incident. Issues addressed include establishing roles and responsibilities, assets management, remains processing and identification, diversity issues and development of a mass fatality plan that affect the construct of a mass fatality response.

Description...

- What if a catastrophic event occurs?
- Will you be ready?
- Will you need a special level of protection?
- Is decontamination necessary?
- Do you have the right medications?
 - This course answers these questions and more as you learn how to distinguish between different agents of concern that could be used in an incident. A combination of facilitated discussions, smallgroup exercises, human patient simulator hands-on scenarios, and traditional classroom discussions are used to present the topics. The multi-discipline make-up of the participants helps to strengthen information sharing, communications, and medical surge capabilities.

- Planning and Preparing for the Hazardous/ Active Threat Environment
- Identifying and Responding to a Hazardous/ Active Threat Environment using the RAPIDCare algorithm
- Personal protective measures and equipment for the Hazardous/Active Threat Environment
- Identifying and caring for victims exposed to a Chemical, Biological, Radiological/Nuclear (CBRN) agent
- Decontamination of victims exposed to a Chemical, Biological, Radiological/Nuclear (CBRN) agent
- Triage and medical care of casualties during a CBRNE incident, Complex Coordinated Terrorist Attack or Active Shooter/Hostile Event
